During this time of year, we get inundated with stories about what happened in the past year. Well, I'm going to do it to you too. Ha!! So, what did we do this year?

Through special Board and Committee members, Douglas Kaufman-Dickson, Krista Kirkham and Keith Pluymers, we developed and adopted a new personnel manual.

We increased our number of volunteer stewards, including apprentice stewards, from 21 to 30, so we have more energetic people helping to preserve and restore our prairies and savannas.

We held some great events during the year that included hikes open to the public, a special walk at Ridgetop Preserve for our large donors, and a River Event at Hayes Preserve exploring mussels of the

In February, we held a retreat with the Board and past Board members, where we discussed fundraising. Ultimately, the Board approved of a proposal by David Allen, of Development for Conservation. At the November Board meeting, the Board approved the proposed Fundraising Plan.

The future is bright for ParkLands! We have a lot to look forward to.

More events will be held. There will be more hikes available, another river event, the Wildflower walk at Merwin, special events for our donors and members and a New Year's hike at Sweeney Woods Preserve.

We continue to attend McLean County Chamber of Commerce events; some are social events and some are educational. By doing this, our staff and Board members are learning more and spreading the word about what ParkLands does.

The Board is going to develop a Diversity, Equity and Inclusion guideline and statement that will guide us into the future.

In February, the Board will hold a retreat to educate themselves on what preserves we have, how it is best to manage them and where ParkLands' priorities are in the future. This can lead to a strategic plan for property ownership.

It can take years to develop a capital project that could include a new storage facility or pavilions or educational facilities. Generally, the process involves the development of a concept, cost estimating, design and then fundraising. For this reason, an ad hoc committee will be formed from Board members to begin the process development of a future capital project.

We have up to three positions on the Board that will be open this year, so there will be a search for energetic and nature-minded candidates to help lead ParkLands into the future. Let us know, if you have an interest in being a part of this movement, either as a Board member or on one of our committees.

As stated, the future is bright for ParkLands and we are so glad that you are helping us move into the future. Thank you!

2023 Stewardship and Land Protection Updates

- ParkLands permanently protected 80 additional acres in Woodford County with a conservation easement in coordination with the Regional Conservation Partnership Program.
- We continued restoration projects at Ridgetop Nature Preserve, Letcher Basin Land and Water Reserve, Merwin Nature Preserve and Weston Cemetery Nature Preserve with funds from the IDNR Natural Areas Stewardship Grant.
- South Merwin's south trail was upgraded by Katie Heger and her team in completion of her Eagle Scout project.

Years with ParkLands

An earlier version of the Parklands web page on their History stated that my father, Trent A. Shepard, was one of the original founders of Parklands. My father used to go duck hunting with several of the other founders. Regarding the other Parklands founders, in 1986 we bought the Lake Bloomington cabin of Paul Snow and I went to Bloomington High School with Becky Lantz, daughter of Stanley Lantz.

Of the recent Parklands Directors, I grew up in Bloomington with Mac Arnold, Paul VanNess and Dan Deneen. Mac contacted my family several years ago and we donated money for a bench at the Merwin trailhead to honor our childhood friends Dana Soper and Jimmy Hiltabrand. Dan suggested I join the Parklands Board.

I have known Guy Fraker for many years and I worked with him and Dr Wil Thielemann on a Parklands project trying to establish a hiking trail along the north bank of the Mackinaw.

At the suggestion of Vickie Robertson, John Robertson and I recently joined the U of I Extension Master Naturalist program, under the guidance of Nick Frillman. The Master Naturalist program often overlaps with Parklands. Another member of our Master Naturalist crew is Janet Wiser. Janet is the steward of the Moon Preserve. John and I have been assisting Janet, along with Tom Niebur, with maintenance at the Moon Preserve. Jason Shoemaker is helping us set up a burn of the Moon Preserve in 2025. We call our Master Naturalist crew the Mighty Warriors. Kathy McLean and Ann Schreifels are also Parklands stewards from our Master Naturalist class.

Why Volunteer?

I have been planting trees and prairie since 1983 and working with ParkLands was a perfect match for this interest in nature. I originally began exploring local nature with Audubon, lead by Margaret and Chuck Hollowell and Dale Birkenholz. I believe a third of all land should be set aside for nature, that there are too many people on our little planet, and that Kentucky Bluegrass has little value.

What is your favorite 'memory' with Parkl ands?

John Robertson and I were active with the YMCA Indian/Y-Guides. Once a year we would organize a hike for the parents and children. Usually Dale Birkenholz would lead us on a hike at Merwin in the spring during the bluebell bloom. Dale was an incredible master of nature and could answer all the children's many questions. It was great fun.
